Starting on October 10, 2025, the Museum Folkwang will present new works by young artists that were created as part of the **Dokumentarfotografie Förderpreise 15 der Wüstenrot Stiftung**. The award winners engage in different ways with existing perspectives on our world that affect both society and individuals. The works combine documentary-fictional and Al-generated imagery and reflect on the political and social constitution of our present.

In Spectators (2025), **Nazanin Hafez** (*1991) reflects on politically charged places in Iran. In your choices should be grounded in reality (2025), **Kristina Lenz & Alex Simon Klug** (*1992/*1991) work with synthetically generated images to question the development of Al image generators. In ANT*HOLOGY: De / Bugging the cultural history of ants (2025), **Malte Uchtmann** (*1996) examines constructions of reality and investigates social systems of order based on the cultural history of ants. In Die Dialektik dieser Arbeit (2025), **Hannah Wolf** (*1985) addresses the German arms industry and uses architectural perspectives to reveal the "ordinary of the extraordinary."
